The Committee is sensitive to your concerns, but it is not within the committee's purview to organize academic debates.

As you know best, it appears that the administration has \dug in its heels" with respect to your termination. It is the committee's opinion that the legal mesures you now are undertaking may be the most appropriate course of action.

However, the Committee asks to be kept informed of your situation so that should future events make it appropriate, the committee can involve itself in the matter.
